# What is the HPV vaccine?






but to protect against HPV, the vaccine gives us a helping hand.



This clever solution teaches your body how to protect itself against HPV,




it really is that simple, and one dose is all you'll require in your lifetime.\*

\*People who have a very weakened immune system or HIV may need three doses.




So, I'm sure you're wondering, does the HPV vaccine hurt?

If you are worried at all, the Nurse will understand and can offer some reassurance.




As it's something new for your body to get used to,
