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Research and Evaluation Strategy Update

Update on Research Strategy

As discussed at the last meeting, we have now begun to form our core principles for our research strategy based on three key pieces of work:

- a) Research mapping across PHW
- b) User vision work with users of our research and intelligence products
- c) Research prioritisation work undertaken by James Lind Alliance

We were asked to provide more details on the third strand of the work and who we have engaged with.

Research by the James Lind Alliance into the research needs of our stakeholders.

1. Background

In December 2021, the Public Health Data, Knowledge and Research (PHDKR) Directorate of Public Health Wales (PHW) approached the [James Lind Alliance \(JLA\)](#) to discuss the feasibility of identifying research and evaluation priorities for PHW, using the JLA's established research prioritisation method. The aim was to inform the development of PHDKR's research and evaluation strategy by involving PHW stakeholders to identify key themes, evidence needs and priority concerns.

The JLA is a UK-based initiative that is supported by the National Institute for Health and Care Research (NIHR). Established in 2004, it has developed a method for involving patients, carers and clinicians in setting priorities for health and social care research.

This report describes the process that was undertaken and the themes and priorities that emerged.

2. Method

An approach was taken, which drew on elements of the JLA process and its principles, namely, to involve a range of stakeholder groups in a process of identifying and then prioritising themes and evidence needs for PHW research and evaluation to address. This was developed iteratively and adapted at each stage in response to stakeholder engagement levels and the nature of the findings as they emerged.

The steps taken were:

- **Survey** of stakeholders to collect priorities/evidence needs
 - Identification of key stakeholders to involve

- Online survey
- Review of survey response to identify key themes
- **Workshop** with stakeholders to examine priority themes in greater depth
 - Online workshop discussion
 - Review of workshop findings and production of workshop report
- **Consultation** with stakeholders to review and input on workshop findings
 - Circulation of workshop report to workshop participants and wider stakeholder group
 - Synthesis of input to workshop report

It was agreed at this point that the exercise had generated sufficient information with which PHDKR could work.

3. Findings and themes

a. Survey findings

This section describes how the survey led to the identification of key themes which then became the basis of further stakeholder consultation. The findings are then described in order of perceived priority, based on the frequency with which they were raised by stakeholders and the level of detail generated about them. These are grouped by sub-themes and subsequent topics which were raised in both the workshop and the consultation.

Twenty-four stakeholders took part in the online survey which aimed to understand how they use current research and evaluation produced by PHW, and to identify potential topics which stakeholders think PHW should prioritise for research and evaluation. The majority were from academic institutions, along with representatives from government, health and social care provision, and think tanks.

To summarise:

- Respondents welcomed the fact PHW was talking and listening to them and wanted this to continue.

- PHW communications should work for multiple audiences to maximise impact.
- They supported the notion of looking strategically at PHW's evidence gaps to ascertain how to fill them or work in partnership with others, namely other organisations in the system who develop evidence/research such as academic institutions, other NHS bodies/health boards and private research companies, by funding, delivering and disseminating research.

The area of health behaviours, mental health and the wider determinants of health emerged as key themes which stakeholders identified as priority research areas for PHW. It was agreed that further consultation would explore these themes and others.

b. Workshop and consultation findings:

The workshop brought together PHW stakeholders from academia, government, policy, health and social care provision and the voluntary sector. The aim was to understand it in more detail and to identify questions or uncertainties which PHW research and evaluation might focus on. Twelve participants attended.

Key research ideas which emerged through the stakeholder survey, which were used to prompt further discussion at the workshop, included:

- Addiction, behaviour change, insights
- Understanding the motivations for people to lose weight/maintain a healthy weight
- Best practice analysis of international action on alcohol and developing capacity to rapidly evaluate interventions on tobacco
- Factors predictive of success or relapse in substance misuse including alcohol
- Mechanisms for enabling behaviour change
- The role of physical activity in disease prevention and management
- Healthy lifestyles - how to help people move more, eat less and reduce obesity.
- Wider determinants of health including social determinants
- Mental Health and Wellbeing
- Complex and interlinked conditions

- The natural and built environment
- Pandemic preparedness and infectious diseases
- Vaccine hesitancy

The discussion group aimed to understand these in more detail, including identifying specific evidence gaps, key questions for research, populations or problems of particular concern which it was felt PHW should prioritise for research and evaluation.

A report of the discussion group was produced, summarising themes that emerged, as well as other topic areas that came out through the workshop discussions, along with further detail of suggested evidence gaps specific to Wales. This report was then circulated back to both participants and stakeholders who were unable to attend. They were asked to review the report and provide their reflections on: whether these were the key research and evaluation gaps that PHW should focus on; if there is evidence on effective interventions that address the suggested evidence gaps, and if there are specific interventions or evidence gaps that PHW should focus on within the themes.

Twenty-three stakeholders contributed to the consultation, including representatives of Welsh Government, independent research institutions, third sector, universities, public health bodies and NHS Wales.

This is useful input into the development of the strategy which will take place alongside the development of the Long-Term strategy. Further work is required to understand the research priorities which fit around many aspects of environmental public health, pathogen genomics and the work of our laboratories.

4. Next steps

This exercise has produced a flavour of the issues that PHW stakeholders are interested in. These issues are expressed in varied terms, from very broad, overarching themes, to more specific, narrowly focused questions.

We will now need to develop our priorities through

- Understanding better those areas which have not been well covered by this exercise: pathogen genomics; laboratories and environmental public health
- Development of the priorities in alignment with PHW's long-term strategy

We will provide a comprehensive update and proposal on research priorities to KRIC in March 2023
