# Cost of living feedback from Young Ambassadors residential on 22-23 February 2023

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## 1. Priorities to feed back to the Board

We asked the YAs to vote for their five top messages to the Board. Here is the full list, in order of popularity.

- i. Stress of pressures at home have a knock-on effect in school, home, work, and social life
- ii. Mental health support and counselling in communities for all ages needs to be improved
- iii. More communication is needed between schools, hospitals, councils etc.
- iv. Youth services and community services eg leisure centres cannot be defunded
- v. Help young people with the cost and availability of public transport
- vi. Have an understanding that there is inequality across Wales when it comes to education and work
- vii. More communication with young people directly (rather than with parents/carers)
- viii. Help with events to prevent unhealthy behaviours
- ix. The cost of living is a key area of interest for young people and they could be better informed of the key issues
- x. More awareness by signposting different support options
- xi. Mandate consultations to approach more young people on the side effects of the cost of living
- xii. Advertise and promote good work options for young people eg social media. Job fairs

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- xiii. Small businesses, independent businesses and small farms are being significantly affected by the cost of living
- xiv. Understand those with higher salaries may also need help with the cost of living but fall outside of the requirement for support
- xv. Continue to provide funding for Young Ambassadors and residentials

The Young Ambassadors also felt it was really important to tell us that accessing GP surgeries and waiting times are having a big impact and will get worse due to the cost of living crisis.

## 2. Solutions the Young Ambassadors would suggest to Welsh Government, local authorities and the NHS

#### **Welsh Government:**

- Like the "dine out to help out" scheme, run a "support local" campaign
- Lottery funding for social services

## Local authorities:

- Cheaper local transport and more provision
- More allotments for home grown food
- Improve local areas eg rivers so they can be used for water sports locally
- More afterschool activities run by councils
- Cheaper or free school uniforms
- Cap on transport costs
- Lower the pass rate in schools young carers or people with part-time jobs don't get the time to study
- School clubs where young people can do their homework a warm place, with the lights on
- More support for families by councils separate from social services because of the stigma

## NHS:

- More access to health services
- Ability to book appointments online
- More mental health support
