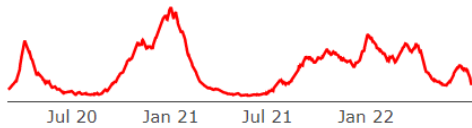

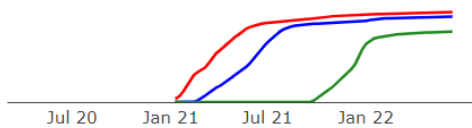

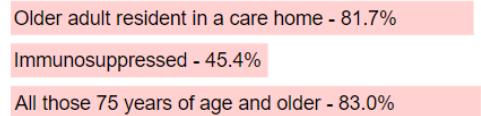
COVID hospital admissions (rolling 7 day ave)

2.5M (D1), 2.4M (D2) & 2M (B) as of 12/06/2022



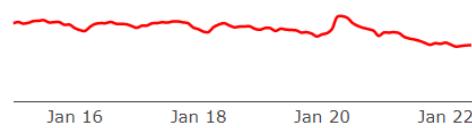
Uptake of COVID-19 Spring Booster among Priority Groups
 as of 12/06/2022



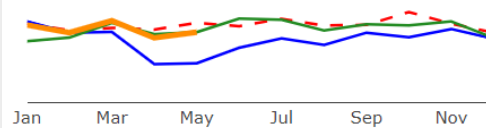

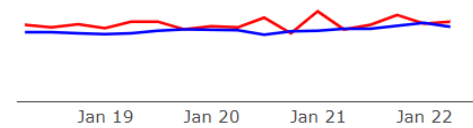

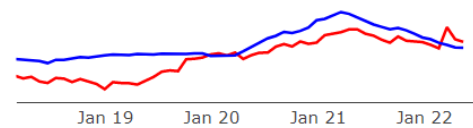

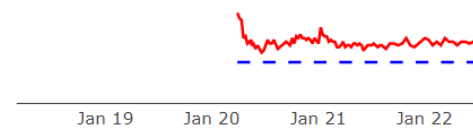

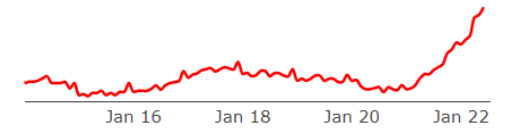

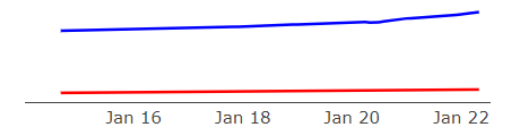

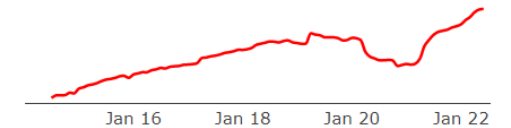

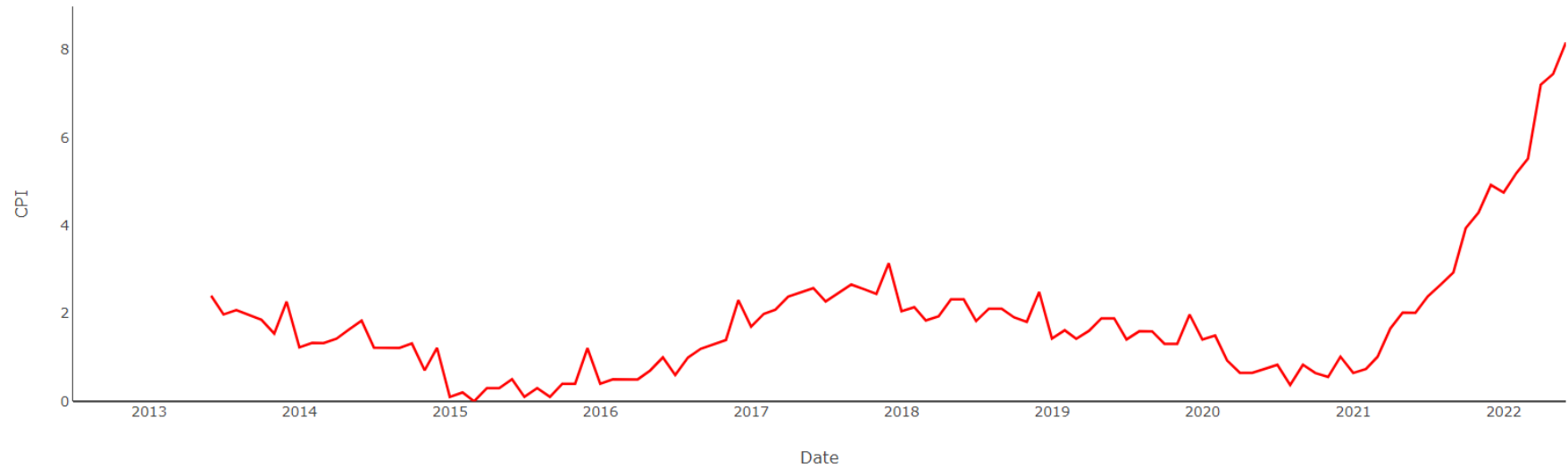

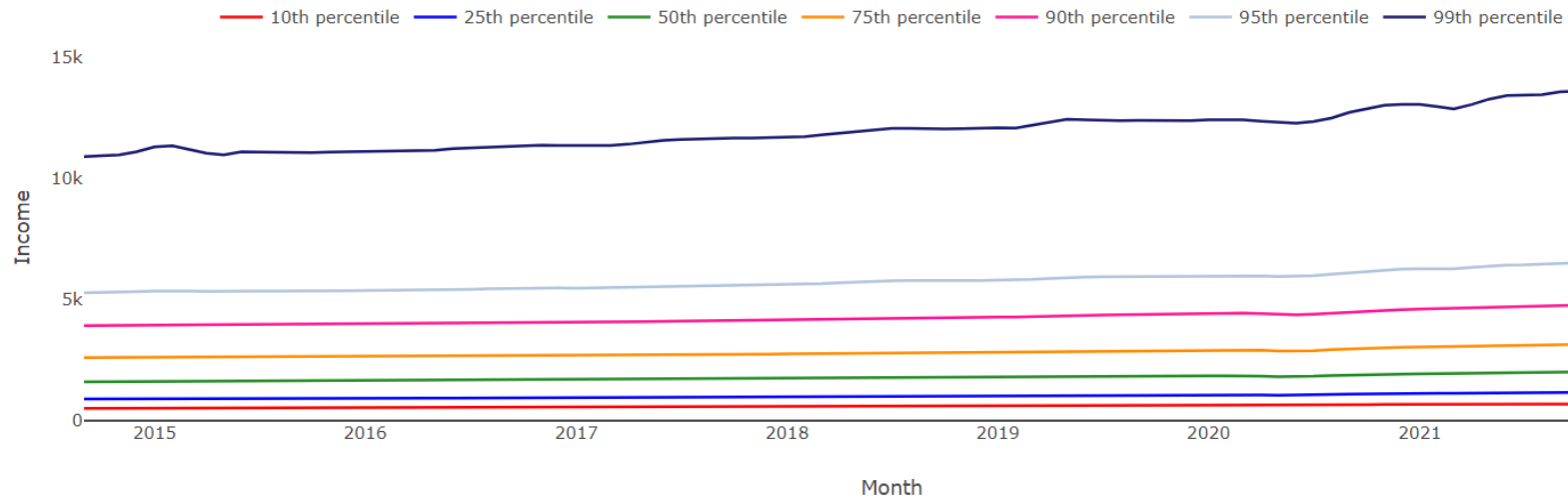

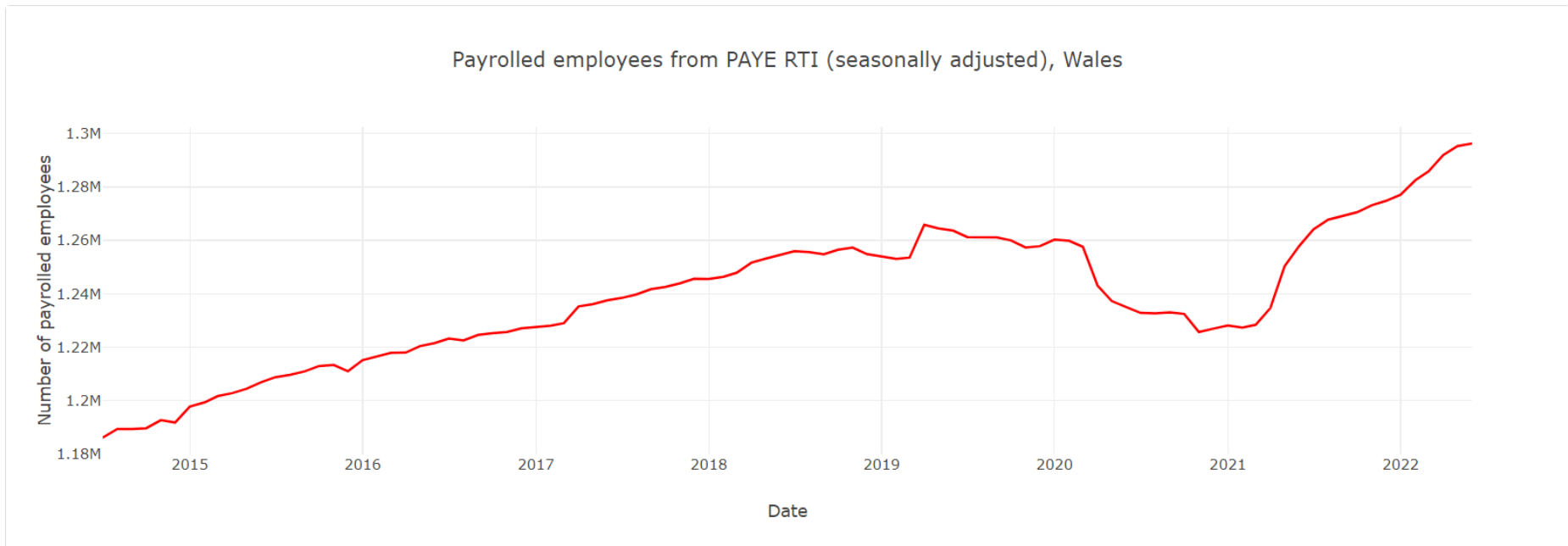
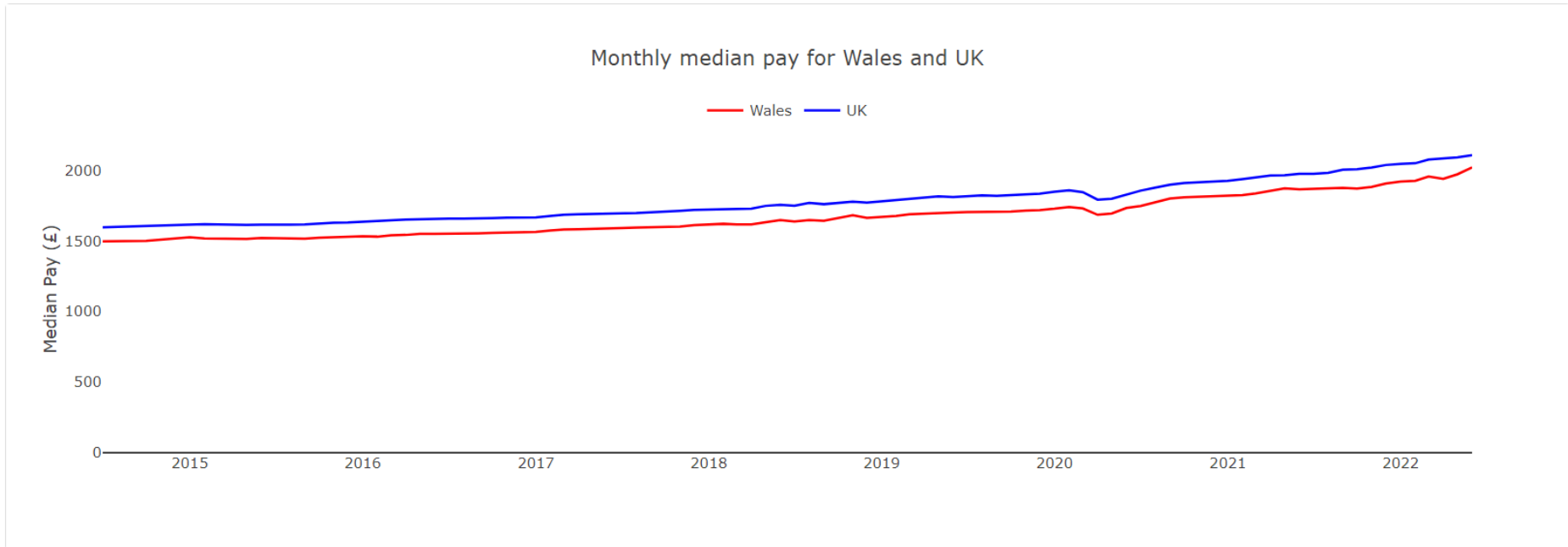
Consumer Price Index, 12-month rate, UK, 01/07/2012 to 01/06/2022



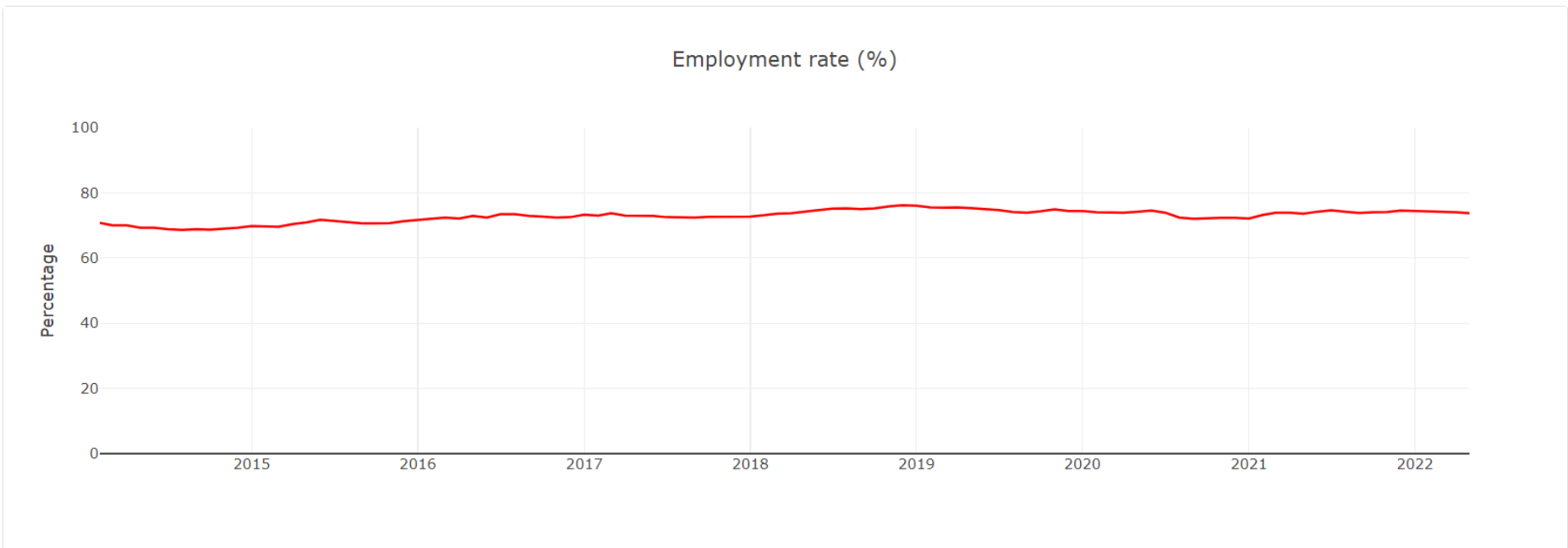
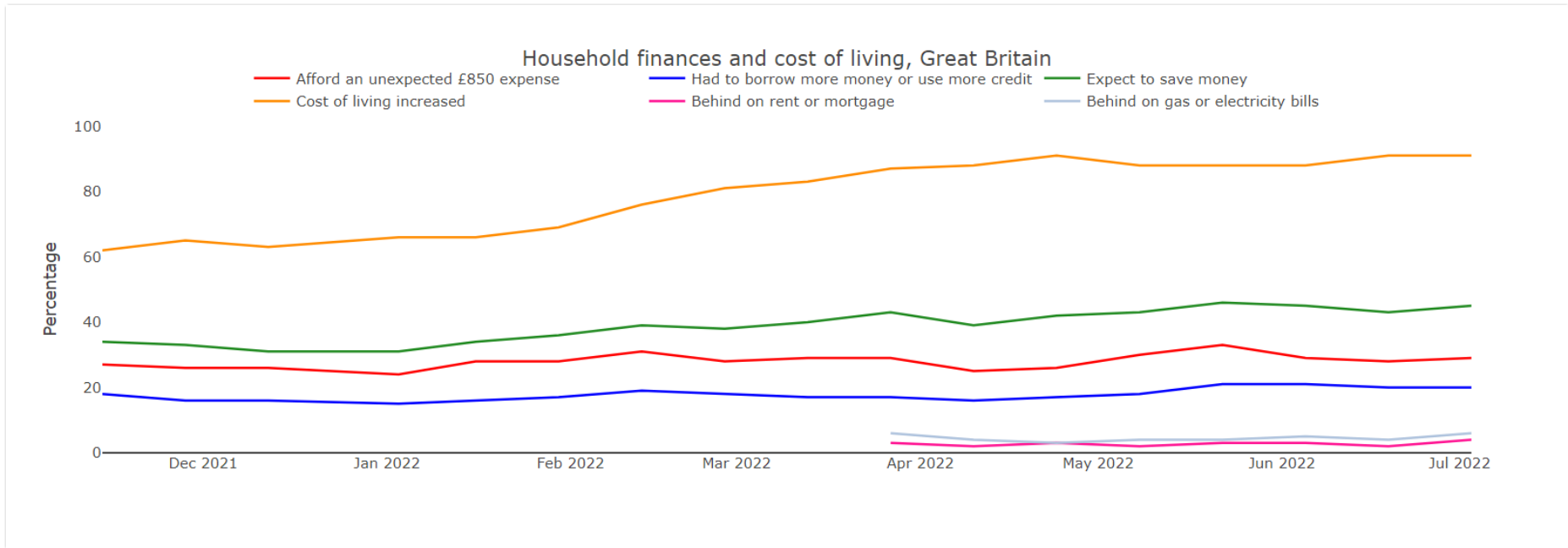
Average monthly earnings by income percentile, UK

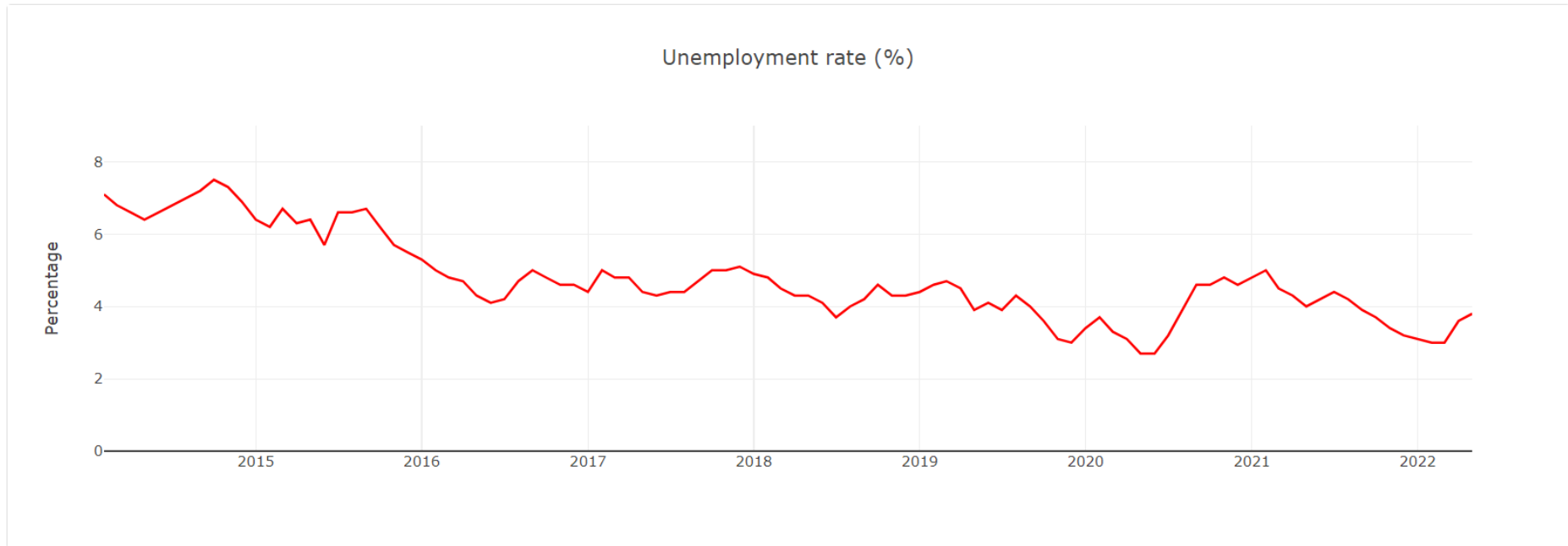
