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Our campaign



Public Health Wales is running a communications campaign to encourage flu vaccination this winter.

The campaign will target the following audiences through paid advertising:

- People aged 65+
- People aged six months to 64 with a long-term health condition
- Pregnant women
- Parents of 2 and 3 year olds
- Parents of school-aged children to Year 11
- Frontline health and social care workers

However, the research is clear: patients place more trust in healthcare professionals than any other source of vaccine information.

Your advice and encouragement can be one of the most important factors in a patient's decision to get vaccinated.

Patient conversations

Research shows that patients place more trust in healthcare professionals than any other source of vaccine information. A single conversation can have a big impact on a patient's decision to get vaccinated.



TOP TIPS FOR BETTER PATIENT CONVERSATIONS

- 1 Personalise the message:** "Given your condition, flu vaccination is particularly important for you"
- 2 Address concerns openly:** Ask about any worries they have and respond thoughtfully
- 3 Share what others do:** "Most people who are eligible choose to get vaccinated"
- 4 Highlight wider benefits:** "Getting vaccinated helps protect your family and community too"
- 5 Signpost to trusted sources:** "Search Public Health Wales vaccines" for more information

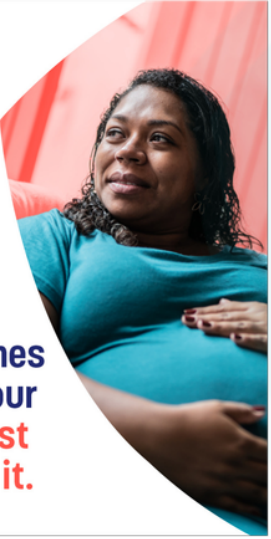
