# **Quality Statement for Musculoskeletal Health**

Welsh Government has published a **quality statement for musculoskeletal (MSK) health** which sets out a vision for the development of better MSK care throughout a person's life. MSKs are the most common cause of physical disability globally and affect up to a third of Wales's population.

#### Welsh Government's aims are:

- To improve and protect the MSK health of the population from an early age.
- To reduce the number of people developing musculoskeletal conditions.
- As well as to improve the health and wellbeing of people with musculoskeletal conditions.

Employers have a crucial role to play in protecting employees' MSK health through preventing MSKs from developing or being exacerbated, promoting good health, as well as supporting employees with MSK conditions. # Rise in the Real Living Wage

Fair reward is an important element of efforts to

implement the principles of fair work in Wales . The Fair Work Commission, established by Welsh Government, published its recommendations in 2019 but there is still a way to go to implement many of the fair work characteristics including fair reward. # **Bowel Screening Wales**

Bowel screening age lowered to 51 in Wales.

People aged 51-54 in Wales will now automatically receive at-home bowel screening tests.

Early detection can save lives, almost nine out of ten people survive bowel cancer when it is treated earlier on. Find out more from **Public Health Wales**.

# The Environmental Protection (Single-use Plastic Products) (Wales) Act

From 30 October 2023 there will be a ban on anyone selling or supplying some single-use plastic products in **Wales**.

In 2022, plastic and polystyrene accounted for 76.5% of all beach litter in Wales. Single-use plastics are discarded without thought, causing harm to wildlife and our environment.



What is being banned?

- Single-use plastic plates this includes paper plates with a laminated plastic surface
- Single-use plastic cutlery for example forks, spoons, knives
- Single-use plastic drinks stirrers
- Cups made of expanded or foamed extruded polystyrene
- Takeaway food containers made of expanded or foamed extruded polystyrene
- Single-use plastic balloon sticks
- Single-use plastic-stemmed cotton buds
- Single-use plastic drinking straws with exemptions so people who need them to eat and drink safely and independently can continue to have them

<u>Business Wales</u> are asking businesses and organisations to get ready for the change by reducing their stock levels, recycling existing stock and consider switching to reusable alternatives – and where this isn't possible, looking at non-plastic alternatives.
