



Targeted Behavioural Test

1. Babies not completing the screen or assessment
2. Babies whose parents request audiological surveillance following one ear clear response
3. Unscreened babies moving in to the area
4. Babies with Down's syndrome
5. Babies with cleft palate
6. Babies with significant cranio-facial abnormality
7. Parental or professional concern about a baby's hearing
8. Significant family history of early onset hearing loss

High Risk Babies:
>48 hours in NICU/SCBU

PASS = CLEAR RESPONSE IN ONE OR BOTH EARS. ONE EAR CLEAR RESPONSE, PARENT CAN REQUEST AUDIOLOGICAL FOLLOW UP
REFER = NO CLEAR RESPONSE IN BOTH EARS AND ONE EAR CLEAR RESPONSE FOR HIGH RISK BABIES

*in certain circumstances screening may be undertaken between 34 and 36 weeks
