Introduction



- The use of Vanishpoint® syringes for the reconstitution of Comirnaty® (Pfizer BioNTech) vaccinations requires a new procedure to be followed.
- Vanishpoint® syringes are self retracting: If the bottom of the plunger of the syringe touches the neck of the syringe barrel the mechanism is triggered and the needle will auto retract into the barrel of the syringe.

Reconstitution


Throughout the entire reconstitution procedure, the plunger of the syringe MUST **NOT** be pushed lower that the 0.5 ml mark of the barrel.















Invert the syringe and remove air and air bubbles.
Obtain a volume check of 2.2mls of saline.





Add 0.5 mls of air into the syringe on top of the 2.2 mls of saline.



Invert the syringe so the needle is pointing downwards creating an air cushion between the plunger and the saline.



Insert needle into the vial and deliver saline into the vial ensuring needle stays in air in the vial **NOT** within solution.

Release plunger to equalise pressure (allow air back into syringe) as required.






STOP when all saline is in vial. **DO NOT** depress the plunger beyond the 0.5 ml mark.





Release the plunger and allow air back into the syringe to at least the 2.2 ml mark to equalise the pressure.

Withdraw the needle from the vial.





ONLY when reconstitution procedure is finished: depress the plunger to the bottom of the barrel to activate the auto-retraction mechanism and retract the needle.
