Is your child up to date with their vaccinations?



2 months old

- 6-in-1 vaccine: diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (whooping cough), polio, haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib) and hepatitis B (HepB)
- Meningococcal group B (MenB)
- Rotavirus



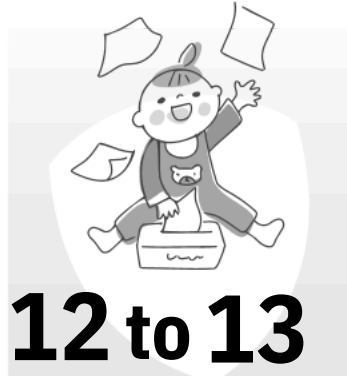
3 months old

- 6-in-1 vaccine: diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (whooping cough), polio, haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib) and hepatitis B (HepB)
- Pneumococcal
- Rotavirus



4 months old

- 6-in-1 vaccine: diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (whooping cough), polio, haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib) and hepatitis B (HepB)
- Meningococcal group B (MenB)



12 to 13 months old

- Haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib) and meningococcal group C (MenC)
- Pneumococcal
- Measles, mumps and rubella (MMR)
- Meningococcal group B (MenB)



2 and 3 years old

- Flu vaccine every autumn – see 1 below



3 to 4 years old

- Flu vaccine every autumn – see 1 below
- 4-in-1 vaccine: diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (whooping cough) and polio
- Measles, mumps and rubella (MMR)



4 to 11 years old

- Flu vaccine in school every autumn – see 2 below



12 to 16 years old

- Flu vaccine in secondary school every autumn (school years 7 to 11)
- Human papillomavirus (HPV) (year 8) – see 3 below
- Tetanus, diphtheria and polio (year 9)
- Meningococcal groups A, C, W and Y (MenACWY) (year 9) – see 3 below
- Measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) if not had two doses already

- 1 Age on 31 August each year.
- 2 Children and young people aged four or older who are not in school can have their flu vaccine at their GP surgery. You just need to make an appointment.
- 3 Young people can still have the free HPV or MenACWY vaccine up to the age of 25.
